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## What we stand for



The whānau can have a lot of fun completing a collage of the special things that they appreciate about each other and then develop a whānau whakatauākī or motto.



1. Collect magazines, newspapers, give-aways, pens and paper and call the whānau together. Ask them to think about the special gifts and talents of each member of their whānau, then either cut out pictures and words, or draw and write down those qualities.
2. Get them to sort their images and words into different envelopes – one person whānau member - and write the name of the person they have written about on each one. There should be one envelope for each whānau member.
3. They then give their envelope to each person, and as they do that, they can tell them what they appreciate about them.
4. Give each person some time alone to go through their envelope of images and words so that they can reflect on what their other whānau members appreciate and love about them.
5. Then call the whānau together again and get them to complete their whānau collage using all the images and words that they were given.
6. As the whānau are putting together their whānau collage, help them to come up with a whānau whakatauākī (motto) and write it at the top of the collage.
7. Be creative and have lots of fun!

### Keep it going

A whānau collage can grow with the whānau as the children grow older by adding other pictures or photos to it over time.
