Whānau Charter

The whānau can now use the whānau whakatauākī (motto), whānau tohu (crest) and the whānau values to design their own whānau charter.



1. Gather the whānau around and take out the whānau whakatauākī, whānau tohu and whānau values together with the other materials (pens, large A3 paper)
2. Briefly tell the whānau that they are going to put the whānau tohu, whānau whakatauākī and values together into a whānau charter
3. Help the whānau to put it all together.
4. Encourage the whānau to be creative!
